### **5.1 CURRENT LANDSCAPE**

Over the last week, as Scotland continues to move through ‘Phase 3’ of the ‘Route map through and out of the Crisis,’ Police Scotland has maintained their measured approach and applied the updated guidelines accordingly. Changes in relation to the re-opening of indoor licensed premises for eating and drinking continue to have no significant impact on frontline policing with the majority adhering to the government guidelines. Mandatory face coverings within retail premises continues to generate calls but no enforcement action has been reported this week.

Quarantine guidelines under the Health Protection (Restrictions) (Scotland) Regulations 2020 were reintroduced for mainland Spain and Islands on Sat 25<sup>th</sup> leading to a slight uplift in Police Scotland referrals to the Home Office. A new pro-active quarantine checking process will shortly be introduced which is led by Public Health Scotland (PHS). Police Scotland will support this initiative in cases where PHS have repeatedly been unsuccessful in making contact with individuals meant to be quarantining.

A highly publicised localised outbreak at a call centre which was reported in the last update has subsided, however a second unrelated outbreak has now emerged in the Greater Glasgow and Clyde Health Board area. The go ahead for Scottish schools to return to full time teaching from the 11<sup>th</sup> August has also been announced.

The weather during this week has been changeable and not assessed to have had any significant impact on the behaviour of the public. Intervention plans are in place for the high temperatures forecast across Scotland for Friday 31<sup>st</sup> July.

### **5.2 SERVICE CENTRE DEMAND**

In the last week, the volume of 101 calls answered decreased slightly compared to the previous week, as did the 999 calls. 101 calls answered are still trending at significantly lower figures than the same time last year, now approx. 25%, however 999 calls answered remains on a par with previous years figures.

### **5.3 INCIDENT DEMAND**

There has been a slight decrease in total incident volumes when compared to last week, with a more significant 20% decrease on the same period last year.

Public nuisance and disturbance incidents have seen a further decline on last week whilst noise calls are up. In comparison to the previous year, most incident types are starting to return to last year’s levels with the notable exception of noise, which is still trending slightly higher.

### **5.4 CRIME**

Crime is currently lower than seasonal averages. Recorded crime has decreased very slightly from the previous week and remains 9% lower than last year.

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### **5.5 COVID-19 INTERVENTION ACTIVITY**

The government guidance remained in 'Phase 3' of easing lockdown restrictions. Throughout the last week Police Scotland's approach to the use of COVID-19 legislation continues to be to firstly engage with people, explain the provisions and encourage them to comply with the necessary restrictions with enforcement action being taken only where absolutely necessary.

The overall style and tone of policing the pandemic in Scotland has not changed since the inception of the public health emergency.

In the last seven days, Police Scotland officers attended 16922 incidents.

The COVID-19 intervention powers have been used on one occasion over the same time period, this was due to 1 arrest which was recorded this week.

Since quarantine regulations came into force on travellers entering Scotland from out with the UK on the 15<sup>th</sup> June, Police Scotland have had 27 instances of alleged non-compliance reported, none of which have so far resulted in enforcement action. As previously stated this may rise in coming weeks due to the change in recording and the reintroduction of measures for those returning from mainland Spain and Islands.

### **5.6 PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)**

Securing suitable PPE remains an ongoing priority and the dedicated Logistics cell has continued to provide extensive training, equipping and resupply, operating on an early shift late shift basis. Supply lines remain fragile and this will be a long term challenge.

Up to and including the 29th July, over 15,900 frontline police officers and staff have been trained in, supplied or resupplied appropriate PPE. This is in conjunction with the provision of significant measures to implement physical distancing within the workplace wherever possible.

### **5.7 ABSENCE**

Over the past week, employee absence levels have consistently trended below levels of the same dates in 2019. Those absences related to COVID-19 have climbed slightly and are currently sitting at 51. It is anticipated that the Scottish approach to 'Test and Protect' in order to limit the spread of the virus moving forwards, will see pockets of absence across teams or shifts. The recent increase from 7 to 10 days for those individuals' with symptoms needing to self-isolate may also adversely affect the absence figures should the number of infections increase.

### **5.8 OFFICER AND STAFF COVID-19 SCREENING**

People & Development continue to support our workforce, providing reassurance to officers and staff who are symptomatic, to assist with returning officers and staff to work as soon as possible. Testing arranged up to the 27<sup>th</sup> July now numbers over 1900. From all testing, 201 have returned as positive for COVID-19.

Testing of asymptomatic officers and staff based on risk commenced on 14th May and 290 tests have been arranged up to and including 27<sup>th</sup> July. None of these tests have yet returned a positive result.

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Contact tracing numbers are now being reported and this currently stands at four, with no positive tests.

Police Scotland continues to be engaged in discussions about the opportunities to introduce workplace antibody testing should a valid test become available in Scotland.

### **5.9 COVID-19 NEAR MISSES**

'Near-miss' forms in the context of the pandemic situation may be submitted for a variety of reasons i.e. when officers are potentially exposed to COVID-19 whilst not wearing PPE, where PPE malfunctions, or in any other instance an officer feels a risk to themselves in a specific occurrence relating to COVID-19. This can occur due to the reactive nature of policing, as well as being influenced by training levels and supply of PPE.

In the last week we have seen 23 of these forms submitted, which is an increase on last week and the highest recorded since mid June. However 16 of the forms submitted were attributable to the process for requesting an asymptomatic COVID-19 screening test due to an occupational risk rather than a typical near-miss incident.

### **5.10 CUSTODY**

'Custody volume' refers to the amount of individuals held in Police Scotland custody facilities at a given time. The number of custodies fell on the approach to 'lockdown', reaching their lowest level on 29th March. Since that date, total custody volumes have increased and, in recent weeks have returned to levels comparable to pre-COVID business as usual. The organisation is seeing traditional weekend peaks returning which was less noticeable during the early stages of lockdown.

### **5.11 SUBMISSION**

This report is submitted to the SPA for information and consideration.

Appendix A – COVID-19 Weekly Bulletin contains the information which will be released publicly by Police Scotland. This information will continue to be released weekly and will synchronise with the weekly SPA reporting for consistent, single data timelines.


The volume of 101 calls answered has shown some fluctuations as the week has progressed. The volume of 999 calls answered also follows a similar pattern throughout the week.

### Incident Demand


Incident volume this week has reduced generally as the week went on, despite an initial increase. Incident volume continues to show lower levels compared to the same time last year.

### Crime Volume (19 March – Present compared to Previous Year)






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## Cumulative Service Centre Demand (19<sup>th</sup> March – 29<sup>th</sup> July 2020)








Weekly Crime by Group



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## Cumulative Crime Demand (9<sup>th</sup> March – 26<sup>th</sup> July 2020)


Total Crime by Group



**Weekly Cooperation Levels**







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


## 'Enforcement' of Coronavirus specific legislation

The following is a summary of all 'enforcement' action in relation to both The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Restrictions) (Scotland) Regulations 2020 and Coronavirus Act 2020.

This includes all Fixed Penalty Notices issued and processed by Police Scotland. It also includes all occasions that a charge was libelled and recorded on Police Scotland's Crime Recording System against a person in relation to the aforementioned legislation. This is a true value of the volume of recorded 'enforcement' activity, but does not provide the granularity of the Coronavirus Intervention (CVI) recording system and does not capture the earlier phases of the '4 E's' approach.

These values remain subject to change as offences are retrospectively added or amended and do not match the indicative 'enforcement' values from the CVI recording system.









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## Near Miss and Testing Data (w/e 23<sup>rd</sup> March – 27<sup>th</sup> July 2020)




'Near miss' forms in the context of the pandemic situation may be submitted for a variety of reasons. i.e. when officers are potentially exposed to: COVID-19 whilst not wearing PPE, where PPE malfunctions, or in any other instance an officer feels a risk to themselves in a specific occurrence relating to COVID-19.

This can occur due to the reactive nature of policing, as well as being influenced by training levels and supply of PPE. The number of forms have increased over the last week.


The amount of forms submitted continues to be attributable to the process for requesting an asymptomatic COVID-19 screening test due to an occupational risk, requiring the submission of a 'near miss' form. Many of the reports would not have been submitted without this requirement. The number of incidents where a lack of PPE is identified has not risen.


