PURPOSE

The Committee asked that a report be provided on a quarterly basis on settlement figures arising from claims raised against Police Scotland. Further information was also sought on actions or claims raised against Police Scotland within the previous quarter and insight into the work currently being undertaken by Police Scotland Legal Services.

The paper is submitted for Information.

1. BACKGROUND

1.1 The SPA Legal Committee directed that a standard report be presented to the Committee each quarter outlining the number of legal cases settled by Police Scotland within the previous financial quarter, claims currently being dealt with by Police Scotland and the identification of any trends arising from the data.

2. FURTHER DETAIL ON THE REPORT TOPIC

- 2.1 This report is set out in three parts. The first part deals with Claims that have been settled by Police Scotland. The second part deals with Claims being currently dealt with by Police Scotland and the third part deals with legal work that does not necessarily attract a claim for financial settlement being undertaken by Police Scotland legal services.
- 2.2 In Quarter 1 of the financial year 2025-26 a total of 277 new files were opened in the Legal Services Department. These are represented by Category, and further by Type in Appendix 2. A further 476 general legal enquiries including 164 disclosure requests (Specification of Documents, Summary Applications, and Non-Scottish Court Orders) were fielded by the department in the quarter.

3. CLAIMS SETTLED IN QUARTER 1 2025/26

- 3.1 The following tables are intended to represent the different type of claim settled or paid following judgement by Police Scotland. The tables provide the total settlement figures under said headings and an average settlement figure. The settlements are broken down into Employer's Liability cases, Employment Tribunal (ET) cases, Public Liability cases and Motor Liability cases. The Committee asked at its meeting in March 2021 that a table be added to the report to show the settlement figures as a percentage of the settlement figures within the current financial year. That figure is now provided within the Tables.
- 3.2 In Quarter 1 of the financial year 2025-26, of the 80 claims settled by Police Scotland; 62 claims were motor related, 3 were employer liability matters, 3 were ET matters, and 12 related to public liability.



3.3 At its meeting in March 2025, the Committee asked for data on settlements to be represented in graphical form so that any spikes in settlements, or trends might be identified more readily. The graph produced here provides data for the last twelve financial Quarters beginning with Quarter 1 of the 2022/23 financial year.



3.4 The Committee asked to be provided with historical figures for the settlement of cases within the 3 categories. Those are represented in the Table at Appendix 1.

4. CURRENT CLAIMS BEING DEALT WITH BY POLICE SCOTLAND

- 4.1 The Committee asked to be provided with extracts from the Claims Register showing the number of cases being dealt with under three headings:
 - 1. Employment Tribunals
 - 2. Employer Liability
 - 3. Public Liability
- 4.2 The following table shows the cases under the heading of Employer Liability for Q1 is 91. Employer Liability cases have remained relatively static and no obvious increases have been identified.

4.3 The following table shows the cases under the heading of Employer Liability but also providing a breakdown as to the types of cases being raised against Police Scotland. The overwhelming majority of cases relate to injuries sustained by officers or staff whilst at work. This is particularly so if trips, slips and falls are considered to be injuries at work. Other types of Employer liability cases remain static and provides no identification of training gaps.

4.5 The following table shows the cases under the heading of Public Liability. Members are aware that a new Claims Register was created and began to be used during the previous financial year. As the Register is used more and the information populated, a representation of the Public Liability cases will be possible in the same format as the Employer Liability cases and the Employment Tribunal cases. At the time of writing there is still insufficient information within the Public Liability Register to represent the figures in such a way at this time, however, it is hoped that this can be included in the next quarterly report. The following tables show the numbers of public liability cases being dealt with by Police Scotland over the previous financial year. Public liability cases are currently at a level that is lower than the previous financial year.

5. NON-FINANCIAL WORK OF LEGAL DEPARTMENT

5.1 At a recent meeting of the SPA Legal Committee, Members raised concerns that although they are sighted on litigation with which Police Scotland are involved where the outcome will involve finance, they were not sighted on other work undertaken by the department that may have reputational implications. There was media commentary following Police Scotland successfully applying for and

obtaining a TERO (Trafficking and Exploitation Risk Order) but the Committee had no knowledge of such actions taking place. Historically, the Committee wished to have information on cases that would or could have an impact on finances due to the SPA's statutory functions in indemnifying the Chief Constable in litigations involving Police Scotland. The Committee wished to be advised on other work that Police Scotland's legal department are involved with.

5.2 Appendix 2 sets out the work of the Legal Department over the previous financial Quarter. More information can be provided within the closed part of the meeting should Members have a particular interest in any matters arising from the data.




