5. Main Report

## 5.1 CURRENT LANDSCAPE

Police Scotland has continued to adapt to changes in coronavirus legislation during the third full week of the national five level system and the introduction of enforceable travel regulations for those local authorities subject to level 3 and 4 restrictions.

On Friday 20 November 2020, eleven local authority areas moved from level 3 to level 4. On Tuesday 24 November 2020, East Midlothian reduced from level 3 to level 2. Midlothian was also similarly scheduled to reduce its level; however, a recent spike in infection rates led to this move being postponed.

The Scottish Government continues with weekly reviews; however, those currently subject to level 4 restrictions will remain there until 1800 hours on 11 December 2020.

The Scottish Government also confirmed that Scotland would join with the other nations in the United Kingdom in easing restrictions over the Christmas period for five days, allowing households to meet with up to two other households in an indoor environment. The First Minister has asked the public to exercise caution when considering the mixing of households, to use technology or meet outdoors for contact wherever possible and, if meeting indoors, to ensure only same "bubble" of households mix throughout the five day period in order to limit the number of interactions and further spread of the virus.

Coronavirus is still impacting on absence levels across the force; however, they are being effectively managed internally by each local policing division. Absence continues to be scrutinised closely to mitigate risk in early course. Police Scotland's Outbreak Management Team (OMT) remains in place, providing an internal 'track and trace' function and advice to police officers and staff, as well as engaging with divisions to assist in limiting any spread of coronavirus throughout the organisation.

Police Scotland's approach remains unchanged through the implementation of the level system and continues to promote 'Engage, Explain and Encourage' methods prior to 'Enforcement' action being taken against apparent breaches of legislation. It remains the position that officers may move more quickly through the 4E process if they perceive that persons are engaging in a blatant, conscious and inexcusable breach of regulations, involving repeat loci or individuals and whether an absence of enforcement would damage public confidence in policing.

## 5.2 SERVICE CENTRE DEMAND

In the last week, the volume of 101 calls answered has increased by 4% from last week's figure whilst the volume of 999 calls has decreased by 6%. 101 calls answered continue to trend at lower levels than the same time last year, being 3% lower. 999 calls are 13% lower when compared with the same week last year.

#### 5.3 INCIDENT DEMAND

Total incident volume has decreased around 6% from last week's figure. There has been a decrease of around 11% when compared to the same dates in 2019. Public nuisance incidents have risen 3% from last week, whilst noise and disturbance incidents have dropped 2% and 6% respectively. When referenced against 2019 figures, disturbance incidents have dropped 22%, whereas noise incidents have increased by 18% and public nuisance incidents have increased by a substantial 118%. This increase in public nuisance calls may be reflective of the implementation of travel regulations across levels 3 and 4 during the reporting week, as the majority of incidents concerning contravention of these are coded as 'public nuisance' on Police Scotland's incident management system. This is also true of other types of COVID regulation breaches.

#### 5.4 CRIME

Crime volume continues to remain lower than seasonal average. Overall crime in the last week is at a lower level than a comparable period last year with the exception of groups one and five crimes which are higher by 1% and 2% respectively. Ten of the thirteen police divisions have experienced lower crime volume than the same period last year; however, Lothians & Scottish Borders, Fife and Forth Valley divisions have all seen a slight increase on last year's equivalent figures.

The collective volume of recorded crimes for every crime group, with the exception of Group 5 crimes, are lower when compared to last year. The cumulative crime demand in every division is lower when compared to the previous year.

## 5.5 COVID-19 INTERVENTION ACTIVITY

As stated above, Police Scotland's approach to the use of COVID-19 legislation remains to firstly engage with people, explain the provisions and encourage them to comply with the necessary restrictions, with enforcement action being taken where there are found to be flagrant and blatant breaches of legislation.

In the last seven days, Police Scotland officers attended 15,937 incidents, a slight decrease of 1% from last week.

Incidents requiring COVID-19 interventions by officers have increased by 8% on the preceding week. 63% of the 2,153 interventions recorded on the CVI system this week took place within private dwellings which remains static from last week.

Since quarantine regulations came into force on travellers entering Scotland from out with the UK on the 15 June, up to and including 8 November 2020, Police Scotland have received 2127 referrals from Public Health Scotland (PHS) relating to potential breaches of quarantine, 531 of which were dealt with by the resolution team and 447 of which have been dealt with by local policing. 1152 referrals were weeded prior to an incident being raised. In respect of resolved referrals, 79% of the foreign travellers were found to be complying with quarantine restrictions. In the majority of the remaining referrals, the

travellers have been untraced due to a variety of reasons such as inaccurate data provided to PHS or the expiration of the quarantine period prior to persons being traced.

There have been 12 FPN issued in relation to breaches of quarantine regulations generated from Home Office or Public Health Scotland referrals and one report to the Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service (COPFS).

#### 5.6 ABSENCE

Employee absence levels have shown a steady reduction throughout the week, but continue to be significantly higher when compared to a similar period last year. COVID-19 cases still continue to emerge, although still at a much lower rate than recent weeks. Contact and tracing processes, both internal and NHS, have an additional impact on absence rates in terms of the requirement for further officers to self-isolate, although these have also reduced this week. Encouragingly, absences related to COVID-19 have a notable drop for the second consecutive, currently **415** from 439.

#### 5.7 OFFICER AND STAFF COVID-19 SCREENING

People & Development continue to support our workforce, providing reassurance to officers, staff and in specific circumstances their family members who are symptomatic and to assist with returning officers and staff to work as soon as possible. Symptomatic testing arranged up to the 26 November 2020 now totals 1420. The number of tests organised by Police Scotland sits at over 3964.

From all testing, 737 have returned as positive for COVID-19.

Testing of asymptomatic officers and staff based on risk commenced on 14 May and 669 tests have been arranged up to and including 28 November 2020. 19 of these tests have returned a positive result.

#### 5.8 COVID-19 NEAR MISSES

'Near miss' forms in the context of the pandemic situation may be submitted for a variety of reasons e.g. when officers are potentially exposed to COVID-19 whilst not wearing PPE, where PPE malfunctions, or in any other instance an officer feels a risk to themselves in a specific occurrence relating to COVID-19. This can occur due to the reactive nature of policing, as well as being influenced by training levels and supply of PPE.

The most current 'near miss' figures available for the dates 17 November until 23 November 2020 confirm that 60 forms were submitted. This is a reduction from the 71 last week.

#### 5.9 GATHERINGS IN PRIVATE DWELLINGS

Scottish Government commissioned data suggests that spread in and between households continues to drive much of the transmission of COVID-19. This analysis has guided the decision to introduce national measures to prevent persons visiting other households in higher risk areas.

Police Scotland have undertaken an assessment of the demand posed by dwelling house gatherings. It should be noted that the methodology of counting of house gatherings is designed to quantify the number of times officers have had to enter a private dwelling or private garden to investigate suspected breach of legislation or guidance, due to the increased risks of COVID transmission associated with these environments; therefore, if officers do not physically attend, or indeed gain entry to the dwelling or garden, this will not be included as a house gathering as there is no evidence there has been one and no increased risk to officers. Information gathered is indicative and should not be considered police statistics.

Indicative figures from the week of 16 November until 22 November 2020, suggest that Police Scotland attended over 303 occurrences of house gatherings throughout the force area, remaining comparable with the 306 attended the previous week; however, enforcement levels have shown a substantial increase.

Notable incidents over the past week include:

## **Ayrshire**

(19/11/2020) Householder has ongoing antisocial behaviour investigation with North Ayrshire Council and has previously been issued 3 FPN for COVID legislation and reports submitted to the Procurator Fiscal on 4 occasions. Further report received for having non-residents within her home. Police attended and again found non-residents within. Householder arrested for Culpable and Reckless conduct.

## **Dumfries & Galloway**

(16/11/2020) Police attended to the report of loud music at the address and were refused entry. Numerous persons were observed through the window; however, several made off prior to Police forcing entry. One individual was charged and one arrested.

## **Edinburgh City**

**(22/11/2020)** Report received of an on-going house party. On police attendance, approximately 20 students from multiple households were traced within. Householder issued with FPN and party dispersed.

#### Fife

(19/11/20) Reports of house party, loud music and door banging continuously with people coming and going from locus. 14 persons plus householder found within. All person's details noted and gathering dispersed. Householder, who is a medical student, issued with an FPN.

## **Greater Glasgow**

**(20/11/2020)** Party within Airbnb apartment. 6 FPN issued and persons ejected. Further report received concerning the same property. On police attendance they found that all persons had returned. FPN were issued to all for a second time and all persons ejected from the house. Property secured by police and keys returned to the owner.

**(21/11/20)** Officers responded to a report of a party and found it to be a 'leaving party' attended by medical and law students. Attendees apologised and fully accepted that they were aware that they were breaching legislation. 27 FPN issued.

#### Lanarkshire

(16/11/2020) Anonymous call received stating that there was a party ongoing at with about 6 persons within. On police arrival, they could hear sounds of a disturbance within; however, persons refused to open the door to police. Entry was forced and 7 persons found within, all from different households. All were issued with FPN.

## **Lothians and Scottish Borders**

(19/11/2020) Reports received regarding noise from within a dwelling house and the householder breaching COVID guidelines. Previous reports had been received regarding this address and householder issued with an FPN and had been warned on other occasions. On arrival, officers heard noise from within. They were permitted entry and found a non-resident within. Due to the householder persistently flouting guidelines, he was issued with a second FPN.

## **North East**

(17/11/2020) Report of house gathering. Officers attended and found 4 persons within. 3 non-residents were dispersed whilst being spoken to and educated by officers, the occupant made active efforts to have persons re-attend. He refused to acknowledge officers' advice and was issued with an FPN.

## Renfrewshire & Inverclyde

(18/11/2020) Report received sounds of raised voices and music playing from within private dwelling. Police attended and afforded access by householder. 5 persons traced within, 4 from differing households in blatant breach of COVID level 3 regulations. FPN issued to all 5.

## **Tayside**

**(24/11/2020)** Report received of a loud house party. Police attended and found a student party ongoing within. 7 FPN issued.

## 5.10 TRAVEL REGULATIONS

Travel regulations came into effect at 1800 hours on Friday 20 November 2020, therefore the following data comprises 20 November until 25 November 2020 inclusive.

Police Scotland has carried out 126 interventions and issued 21 FPN were issued in respect of travel regulations within the time frame referenced.

Notable incidents during this period include:

## **Argyll & West Dunbartonshire Division**

(22/11/2020) 2 persons in public place in Helensburgh asked to return to their local authority areas.

## **Greater Glasgow Division**

(20/11/2020) 3 males traced in Glasgow having travelled from Birmingham. All issued with FPN.

## **Lothians & Scottish Borders Division**

**(21/11/2020)** Report of persons hare coursing. Police attended and traced persons within a vehicle with lurcher-type dogs. Persons found to have travelled from a level 3 area to a level 2. 4 FPN issued.

## **Tayside Division**

(21/11/2020) 2 persons from out with area and wild camping issued with FPN.




## **Service Centre Demand**

Crime Volume (9 March – Present compared to Previous Year)


Crime has continued to trend at levels lower than the seasonal average, and total crime volume year to date continues to remain considerably lower (6%) than last year.




Absences throughout the entire week has continued to trend above levels when compared to 2019.



## Attended 'House Gatherings' Breaching Restrictions















## Near Miss and Testing Data (w/e 23<sup>rd</sup> March – 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2020)



'Near miss' forms in the context of the pandemic situation may be submitted for a variety of reasons. i.e. when officers are potentially exposed to: COVID-19 whilst not wearing PPE, where PPE malfunctions, or in any other instance an officer feels a risk to themselves in a specific occurrence relating to COVID-19.

This can occur due to the reactive nature of policing, as well as being influenced by training levels and supply of PPE. This number of 'Near Miss' weekly submissions is not available for the current week.


The amount of forms submitted continues to be attributable to the process for requesting an asymptomatic COVID-19 screening test due to an occupational risk, requiring the submission of a 'near miss' form. Many of the reports would not have been submitted without this requirement. The number of incidents where a lack of PPE is identified has not risen.
