How many of these reports/allegations in the time frame stated have led to arrests and charges?

For each allegation, could you please provide location, brief details of the case and if possible gender of victim.

If you require any classification please do not hesitate to ask

If you provide the information in a pdf spreadsheet that would be preferable, but any format would be accepted

Please keep within the allocated budget for dealing with FOI requests".

If you remain dissatisfied after review, you can appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months. You can apply online, by email to enquiries@itspublicknowledge.info or by letter to Scottish Information Commissioner, Kinburn Castle, Doubledykes Road, St Andrews, Fife, KY16 9DS.

Should you wish to appeal against the Commissioner's decision, you can appeal to the Court of Session, only if you think the law has not been applied correctly.
