# Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002

### Request

- 1. Emergency powers, pursuant to s.46 of the Children Act 1989
- 2. The number of children removed using Section 46
- 3. The identified Emergency Harm
- a. Domestic Violence
- b. Sexual Abuse
- c. Self Harm
- d. Induced or Fabricated Illness
- e. Parental alienation
- f. Other please identify
- 4. The ages and gender of the removed children

## Response

Your request for information has been considered and the Scottish Police Authority is able to provide the following:

The Authority does not hold the information you have requested. Therefore, this represents a notice in terms of Section 17 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 - Information not held.

The Authority provides governance and oversight of policing in Scotland, it is not an operational policing body. Police Scotland are responsible for enacting any relevant emergency powers identified in legislation.

#### **Right to Review**

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision.

Should you wish to appeal against the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
