4.1	This report aligns to both Police Scotland's Strategic Outcomes and the Operation TALLA Strategic Objectives as set out by DCC Malcolm Graham.  This report discusses the flexible and adaptable response to the challenges posed by COVID-19 by Police Scotland (SO1, SO2 and SO5). It further highlights the activities undertaken by Police Scotland to protect our people (SO4). The levels of intervention activity discussed in the report serve to protect our communities from COVID-19 (SO1, SO2). The frequent, transparent publication of papers, such as this, and those published on the Police Scotland website provide engagement with communities, to maintain trust and confidence (SO3).									

5. Main Report

## 5.1 CURRENT LANDSCAPE

Scotland continues to operate under the level or tiered system approach, which includes enforceable travel regulations for those local authorities subject to level 3 and 4 restrictions.

The status quo continues from last week, with indication that level 4 restrictions will remain in place until 1800 hours on 11 December; however, it is currently unclear to what extent restrictions will ease.

The announcement that Scotland would join with the other nations in the United Kingdom in the lifting of restrictions over the Christmas period for five days remains the intention; however, the First Minister continues to ask the public to exercise caution when considering the mixing of households, to use technology or meet outdoors for contact wherever possible in order to limit the number of interactions and further spread of the virus.

Coronavirus is still having an impact on absence levels across the organisation; however, they continue to be internally managed by each local policing division. Absence levels and trends are monitored closely in order to mitigate risk and address any emerging resourcing demands in early course. Police Scotland's Outbreak Management Team (OMT) remains in place, providing an internal 'track and trace' function and advice to police officers and staff, as well as engaging with divisions to assist in limiting any spread of coronavirus throughout the organisation. Learning opportunities from previous outbreaks are being identified and collated by the team and these will be communicated across all divisions and departments.

Police Scotland's approach remains unchanged through the implementation of the level system and continues to promote 'Engage, Explain and Encourage' methods prior to 'Enforcement' action being taken against apparent breaches of legislation. It remains the position that officers may move more quickly through the 4E process if they perceive that persons are engaging in a blatant, conscious and inexcusable breach of regulations, involving repeat loci or individuals and whether an absence of enforcement would damage public confidence in policing.

## 5.2 SERVICE CENTRE DEMAND

In the last week, the volume of 101 calls answered has increased by 4% from last week's figure whilst the volume of 999 calls has decreased by 6%. 101 calls answered continue to trend at lower levels than the same time last year, being 3% lower. 999 calls are 13% lower when compared with the same week last year.

## 5.3 INCIDENT DEMAND

Total incident volume has decreased very slightly (0.4%) from last week's figure and by around 7% when compared to the same dates in 2019. Public nuisance incidents have

dropped 3% from last week, returning to the same level as the previous week, whilst noise and disturbance incidents have increased marginally, by 0.9% and 0.4% respectively.

When referenced against 2019 figures, disturbance incidents have dropped 17%, whereas noise incidents are greater by 20% and public nuisance incidents have increased by 58%. This increase in public nuisance calls may be attributed to the implementation of coronavirus legislation and the majority of reports received by the public concerning breaches of these regulations, being coded accordingly as 'public nuisance' incidents by Contact, Command and Control.

## 5.4 CRIME

Crime volume continues to remain lower than seasonal average. Overall crime in the last week is at a lower level than a comparable period last year with the exception of group four crimes which are 5% higher. Ten of the thirteen police divisions have experienced lower crime volume than the same period last year; however, North East, Lothians & Scottish Borders and Fife divisions have all seen a slight increase on last year's equivalent figures.

The collective volume of recorded crimes for every crime group, with the exception of Group 5 crimes, are lower when compared to last year. The cumulative crime demand in every division is lower when compared to the previous year.

## 5.5 COVID-19 INTERVENTION ACTIVITY

As stated above, Police Scotland's approach to the use of COVID-19 legislation remains to firstly engage with people, explain the provisions and encourage them to comply with the necessary restrictions, with enforcement action being taken where there are found to be flagrant and blatant breaches of legislation.

In the last seven days, Police Scotland officers attended 16,391 incidents, a slight increase of about 3% from last week.

Incidents requiring COVID-19 interventions by officers have decreased by about 18% on the preceding week. 67% of the 1,769 interventions recorded on the CVI system this week took place within private dwellings which is a slight rise on last week's 63%.

Since quarantine regulations came into force on travellers entering Scotland from out with the UK on the 15 June, up to and including 29 November 2020, Police Scotland have received 2246 referrals from Public Health Scotland (PHS) relating to potential breaches of quarantine, 543 of which were dealt with by the resolution team and 458 of which have been dealt with by local policing. 1245 referrals were weeded prior to an incident being raised. In respect of resolved referrals, 79% of the foreign travellers were found to be complying with quarantine restrictions. In the majority of the remaining referrals, the travellers have been untraced due to a variety of reasons such as inaccurate data provided to PHS or the expiration of the quarantine period prior to persons being traced.

There have been 12 FPN issued in relation to breaches of quarantine regulations generated from Home Office or Public Health Scotland referrals and one report to the Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service (COPFS).

### 5.6 ABSENCE

Employee absence levels have again reduced throughout the week, but continue to be significantly higher when compared to a similar period last year. COVID-19 cases are emerging at a much lower rate than recent weeks and divisions are coping locally with outbreaks and contact/tracing requirements. Encouragingly, absences related to COVID-19 have a notable drop for the third consecutive week, currently **379** from 415.

## 5.7 OFFICER AND STAFF COVID-19 SCREENING

People and Development continue to support our workforce, providing reassurance to officers, staff and in specific circumstances their family members who are symptomatic and to assist with returning officers and staff to work as soon as possible. Symptomatic testing arranged up to and including 5 December 2020 now totals 1420. The number of tests organised by Police Scotland sits at over 4160.

From all testing, 785 have returned as positive for COVID-19.

Testing of asymptomatic officers and staff based on risk commenced on 14 May and 748 tests have been arranged up to and including 7 December 2020. 20 of these tests have returned a positive result.

## 5.8 COVID-19 NEAR MISSES

'Near miss' forms in the context of the pandemic situation may be submitted for a variety of reasons e.g. when officers are potentially exposed to COVID-19 whilst not wearing PPE, where PPE malfunctions, or in any other instance an officer feels a risk to themselves in a specific occurrence relating to COVID-19. This can occur due to the reactive nature of policing, as well as being influenced by training levels and supply of PPE.

The most current 'near miss' figures available for the dates 24 November until 30 November 2020 confirm that 69 forms were submitted. This is an increase of 9, from the 60 last week.

## 5.9 GATHERINGS IN PRIVATE DWELLINGS

Scottish Government commissioned data suggests that spread in and between households continues to drive much of the transmission of COVID-19. This analysis has guided the decision to introduce national measures to prevent persons visiting other households in higher risk areas.

Police Scotland have undertaken an assessment of the demand posed by dwelling house gatherings. It should be noted that the methodology of counting of house gatherings is designed to quantify the number of times officers have had to enter a private dwelling or private garden to investigate suspected breach of legislation or guidance, due to the increased risks of COVID transmission associated with these environments; therefore, if

officers do not physically attend, or indeed gain entry to the dwelling or garden, this will not be included as a house gathering as there is no evidence there has been one and no increased risk to officers. Information gathered is indicative and should not be considered police statistics.

Indicative figures from the week of 23 November until 29 November 2020, suggest that Police Scotland attended over 311 occurrences of house gatherings throughout the force area, a slight increase on the 303 attended the previous week; however, enforcement levels have dropped significantly, from 352 FPN and 36 arrests last week, to 184 FPN and 10 arrests this week.

Notable incidents over the past week include:

## **Argyll and West Dunbartonshire**

**(24/11/2020)** Anonymous report of a house party received which has been a regular occurrence. Occupants initially refused to open the door and stated they would barricade it; however, they were eventually persuaded to open the door. On entering, officers found a poker game in progress. 10 persons were issued FPN as well as further charges issued regarding drug misuse within.

## **Ayrshire Division**

**(27/11/2020)** Report received of a disturbance within a dwelling house. On arrival, police found 6 persons within and all were hostile towards them. The householder, who had been seriously assaulted, was also hostile. 5 FPN issued.

## **Dumfries & Galloway Division**

(27/11/2020) Householder had a party within his house with 7 others in attendance. Male was already on bail for breach of COVID legislation. He was arrested and 2 further FPN were issued.

### **Edinburgh City Division**

**(28/11/2020)** Report of party with 25 students found within. 23 persons were dispersed and the 2 occupants arrested for homophobic abuse and obstruction/police assault.

## **Forth Valley Division**

**(28/11/2020)** Party ongoing at property and failed to allow police access. Property forced and people within continued to be uncooperative. 5 FPN issued and householder reported for Culpable & Reckless Conduct.

## **Greater Glasgow Division**

**(24/11/2020)** Airbnb property subject to regular reports of excessive noise and breach of COVID regulations. Police attended and noted several persons within; however, they refused to answer the door. Entry was forced and officers found several persons from different households within. 5 FPN were issued to all present.

#### **Lanarkshire Division**

**(28/11/2020)** Police attended a report of a house party and found approximately 15 youths within. Householder refused to accept or comply with the regulations therefore was issued with an FPN and youths dispersed.

#### **Lothians and Scottish Borders Division**

**(29/11/2020)** Report of 'rave' at remote location. Police attended and on arrival at the cottage saw obvious signs of a house party. On entering the property, the occupier stated he was hosting a birthday party and did not believe in the COVID legislation. All were asked to leave the party and refused. Details noted of all in attendance and 10 FPN issued. All believed to have travelled from Edinburgh to attend the party.

### **North East Division**

(17/11/2020) Following a road crash in Tayside, driver was traced within an Airbnb rented by 7 friends from Aberdeen area. Driver was arrested for contravention of s5 Road Traffic Act 1988 (drink driving) and 7 FPN issued.

## Renfrewshire & Inverclyde Division

**(29/11/2020)** Report of noisy 18<sup>th</sup> birthday party at locus. 14 persons found within. 14 FPN issued and group dispersed.

## **Tayside Division**

**(27/11/2020)** Report of parties at 2 large lodges with numerous cars coming and going. About 40 persons ran off on Police arrival. 5 females and some drug paraphernalia found within property. FPN issued and enquiries ongoing regarding drug offences.

## 5.10 TRAVEL REGULATIONS

At 1800 hours on Friday 20 November 2020, legislative travel restrictions were introduced across local authorities subject to levels 3 and 4 restrictions. The following data comprises travel regulations interventions from 26 November until 2 December 2020 inclusive.

Police Scotland has carried out 60 interventions and issued 40 FPN in respect of travel regulations within the time frame referenced.

Notable incidents during this period include:

## **Forth Valley Division**

**(29/11/2020)** 2 males called police reporting having lost their way on the Crianlarich hills and losing daylight, were in rough terrain and unable to get down. Officers and Mountain Rescue Team attended, traced the males safe & well and escorted them from the hills. Both males had travelled from Greenock and were issued with FPN.

## **Greater Glasgow Division**

(26/11/2020) Male and 2 females traced within a vehicle. Male was under the influence of drugs and all 3 were from Fife, having travelled to Glasgow for no valid reason. FPN issued to all.

## **Lothians & Scottish Borders Division**

**(21/11/2020)** Energy Company reported approximately 12 males fishing near Torness Power station. Some made off on police arrival; however, 5 were traced by officers. 3 were found to reside in Edinburgh and 2 in Newcastle. All were issued with FPN.

## **North East Division**

**(21/11/2020)** Anonymous informant contacted Police regarding breach of COVID travel regulations. Police attended and confirmed that a male has travelled from Edinburgh to Lossiemouth, and was issued with an FPN.

## **Renfrewshire & Inverclyde Division**

**(25/11/2020)** Officers conducted routine vehicle stop. Two occupants reside within current Level 4 area (Glasgow) and had attended Inverclyde to attend a local beauty clinic for a sunbed. FPN issued due to blatant breach of current travel restrictions.

## 5.11 SUBMISSION

This report is submitted to the SPA for information and consideration.

Appendix A – COVID-19 Weekly Bulletin contains the information which will be released publically by Police Scotland. This information will continue to be released weekly and will synchronise with the weekly SPA reporting for consistent, single data timelines.




## **Service Centre Demand**

Crime Volume (9 March – Present compared to Previous Year)


Crime has continued to trend at levels lower than the seasonal average, and total crime volume year to date continues to remain lower (6%) than last year.




Absences throughout the entire week has continued to trend above levels when compared to 2019.






All Crime Groups show a decrease in volume when the preceding weeks volume is compared to the same period in 2019 with the exception of Group 4 and 5 crimes.

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



# Weekly Travel Regulation Co-operation (26th November – 2nd December 2020)





An 'interaction' is any instance where a Police Officer has reason to engage with a person who is not conforming with Legislation. Only when all efforts to encourage co-operation fail will Police Officers resort to enforcement.





In order to report upon policing interventions in respect of the newly introduced Travel Regulations regarding travel to or from tiers 3 and 4, the CVI system has been updated. The above data is a sub-set of the wider CVI interventions reported on the previous slides and should not be considered as 'in addition to' the previous overall CVI activity slides.

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


# 'Enforcement' of Coronavirus specific legislation

The following is a summary of all 'enforcement' action in relation to both The Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Restrictions) (Scotland) Regulations 2020 and Coronavirus Act 2020.

This includes all Fixed Penalty Notices issued and processed by Police Scotland. It also includes all occasions that a charge was libelled and recorded on Police Scotland's Crime Recording System against a person in relation to the aforementioned legislation. This is a true value of the volume of recorded 'enforcement' activity, but does not provide the granularity of the Coronavirus Intervention (CVI) recording system and does not capture the earlier phases of the '4 E's' approach.

These values remain subject to change as offences are retrospectively added or amended and do not match the indicative 'enforcement' values from the CVI recording system.






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## Volume of Covid-19 Charges by Date







# **Total Absence (18<sup>th</sup> March – 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2020)**







# Near Miss and Testing Data (w/e 23<sup>rd</sup> March – 30<sup>th</sup> November 2020)




'Near miss' forms in the context of the pandemic situation may be submitted for a variety of reasons. i.e. when officers are potentially exposed to: COVID-19 whilst not wearing PPE, where PPE malfunctions, or in any other instance an officer feels a risk to themselves in a specific occurrence relating to COVID-19.

This can occur due to the reactive nature of policing, as well as being influenced by training levels and supply of PPE. This number of 'Near Miss' weekly submissions is not available for the current week.

The amount of forms submitted continues to be attributable to the process for requesting an asymptomatic COVID-19 screening test due to an occupational risk, requiring the submission of a 'near miss' form. Many of the reports would not have been submitted without this requirement. The number of incidents where a lack of PPE is identified has not risen.
